




Join the AFP

Launch your career with the AFP

Experience a career that is challenging and rewarding, where day-to-day the work you do will make a difference. The AFP gives you a lifetime of opportunities with over 200 types of roles and a variety of locations across Australia and the world.

As a Protective Service Officer (PSO) in the AFP, you will be trained to detect, deter and disrupt criminal activity. You will be a frontline defender against terrorism and national security threats for critical infrastructure, key locations and important persons. This may involve high-visibility vehicle, foot and bike patrols and responding to alarms. You will experience flexibility, with shift work giving you more consecutive days off. You will know what shifts you're working up to a year in advance, allowing you to plan around your individual lifestyle.



Live and work in stunning Australian landscapes

The AFP provides protective services for key infrastructure in remote locations across Australia including Exmouth, Geraldton and Pine Gap. Working as a PSO in these locations allows you to enjoy stunning scenery, outdoor recreation and tight-knit communities along with additional financial benefits.

📍 **Exmouth, WA**, is a town on the Coral Coast near the heritage listed Ningaloo Marine Park, 1,270km north of Perth. The region offers a range of outdoor activities, including whale watching, fishing and snorkelling. PSOs provide high-visibility patrols and protection for the Naval Communication Station Harold E. Holt.

📍 **Geraldton, WA**, is a regional city on the Coral Coast 424km north of Perth. The region offers a range of outdoor recreational activities, including water sports and fishing, as well as arts and entertainment. PSOs based in Geraldton provide high-visibility patrols and protection for the Australian Defence Satellite Communication Station.

📍 **Pine Gap, NT**, is a Joint Defence Facility approximately 18km south-west of Alice Springs. Alice Springs offers a range of sports and cultural activities. PSOs based at Pine Gap provide high-visibility patrols and protection for the Joint Defence Facility.



In addition to the salary and allowances outlined in the AFP Enterprise Agreement, PSOs in these locations receive the Remote Defence Capability Payment and Remote Localities Allowance. Depending on the location, these additional payments combined can range from approximately \$13,000 to \$40,000 per year.
