



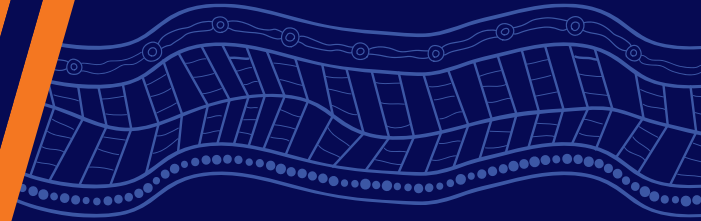
Join the AFP

As a Protective Service Officer (PSO) in the AFP, you will be trained to detect, deter and disrupt criminal activity. This may involve high-visibility vehicle, foot and bike patrols and responding to alarms. You will be a frontline defender against terrorism and national security threats for critical infrastructure, key locations and important persons.

Opportunities exist for PSOs to deploy across Australia or internationally. Working in remote locations attracts additional benefits and allowances on top of your salary. Experience flexibility, with shift work giving you more consecutive days off. You will know what shifts you're working up to a year in advance, allowing you to plan around your individual lifestyle.



Your path into the AFP

Pass each of these gateways to be placed in our merit pool.

- ✓ **Check eligibility and apply**
Start your journey at afp.gov.au/jobs
- ✓ **Entrance exam**
You will take a series of online tests, including cognitive ability tests.
- ✓ **Fitness assessment**
You will be assessed against the required physical standard.
- ✓ **Employment Suitability Questionnaire**
You will provide us with more details about your character, background and traffic history.
- ✓ **Assessment centre**
You will take part in team-based activities, scenarios and an interview.
- ✓ **Security assessment**
Your suitability to access official and classified information will be assessed.
- ✓ **Health assessment**
Your physical and psychological health will be assessed.



Eligibility

To be an AFP PSO, you must:

- be aged 18 years or over
- be an Australian citizen
- hold a valid full or provisional Australian driver's licence
- hold at least one of the following qualifications:
 - a Year 10 Certificate and 2 years of work experience
 - a Year 10 Certificate and a nationally recognised vocational education qualification at a Certificate III level or higher
 - a Year 12 Certificate
 - a vocational education or university qualification at a Diploma level or higher.
